FRED THIRD IN WORLD FINAL

Wembley's Fred Bouttell gained high honours for the Middlesex League by coming third in the World Cycle Speedway Championship at Garratt Park on July 30th. Fred tied with Brian Moston for second place with 11 points. Although gating first in the run off, Fred was passed by Moston and had to be content with the third placing.

Both Bill Punter and Dixie Dean also gave good accounts of themselves. They scored 9 and 9½ respectively. Dixie set up fastest time of the day (40 seconds). He was doubtfully excluded for boring in an earlier heat. Bill gave a very colourful display, picking up most of his points from behind with some good bursts of speed.

The winner was Les Westwood of Edmonton who rode very well for the Championship. Fred Bouttell was one of the 3 to beat him, another being Dixie Dean.
