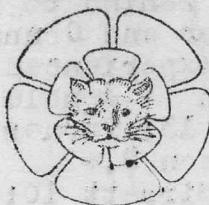

BRADFORD CYCLE SPEEDWAY ASSOCIATION NOTES

November Committee Meeting

Opening the meeting at 8pm Mr John Broadbent welcomed over 50 would-be cycle speedway riders and expressed the hope that by next Easter the Bradford League would be in operation. The first item to be considered was the election of officers. Popular Lindale Manager John Broadbent was voted unanimously as Chairman and the posts of Treasurer and Secretary went to Mike Cockcroft for the time being, with these positions to be reviewed later in the year.

Next item on the agenda was to ascertain the number of teams who wished to affiliate to the Association. After discussion Affiliation forms were sent out to be returned by Nov. 30th. In this way the full complement of teams for next season would be known by early December, thus the pooling of the Lindale riders could be arranged before the start of the season.

The Committee will consist of one member from each of the teams (to be nominated by the team).

The question of competitions was then raised. It was decided to run a league competition, a KO competition (Home and Away basis) and the usual Individual competitions, (age limits to be decided later). Mr Broadbent stated that he hoped that challenge matches with teams in the Manchester, Stockport and District League could be arranged for next year, and that Inter-County matches with Lancashire and Cheshire would be able to be continued as in previous years. At this point Mr Broadbent said he would like to thank the Manchester League for all the help that they had given to the Yorkshire teams, and and the good wishes for the Bradford League.

After asking for the speedy return of the affiliation forms so that further plans could be made the meeting closed at 9.50pm

HENCHLIFFE WINS MANCHESTER FINAL FOR SECOND YEAR !

On Sun. Oct. 30th at Openshaw Monarchs track Vic Hinchliffe won the Manchester Individual Championship Final for the second year in succession, so equalling Mostons wins in 1951 and 1952. Vic who has had rather a quiet season came back to form with a bang and gained his points with some fast outside overtaking. When he won the Final at Carrswood last year he dropped his only point to Den McGee and the only point he dropped this year was to...? Dennis McGee ! The final started off well for Johnny Bartholomew who broke his bottom bracket before the match began. Taken all round it was a day of breakages with Roy Lock cracking his frame, and Vinny Marsland his pedal in Ht 13, and pushing home for third place.

The meeting started off with wins from Marsland, Garnett, McGee and Cockcroft. By the half-way stage Marsland and Garnett were uneaten with Hinchliffe having only dropped one point and Watling, Jolly and Cockcroft still in the running. Nanfan had had two races and had had two nasty looking falls. Ht 12 saw Garnett, Hinchliffe & Marsland line up in that order with Hinchliffe riding round Ganx on the second lap and Vinny pushing home for 3rd. Bates put himself closer with a win in Ht 14 and then team-mate Cockcroft won the next one to keep the Yorkshire challenge strong. Ht 17 saw Marsland assure himself of a place with a good win over Sutcliffe.

To show there's still life in the old dog, yet Nanfan collected 5 points from his last two rides. Ht 18 and Garnett needed a win to equal Hinchliffes score but a tangle with Watling whilst fighting it out at the front and a last was all he managed. Cockroft won his last race and so with Hinchcliffe Champion for 1960 and Marsland runner-up, Cockroft and Garnett had to run-off for third.

Moston had a bad day being excluded for hooking in Ht 14, this being only the second time in 10 years that he hasn't been placed in the first three. Watling started off well but faded in the 2nd half. Most improved rider was Ged Jolly who got all his points from the back with some clever passing, to finish 5th.

To sum up it was a good final with plenty of surprises and plenty of good racing. The track was looking the best it has ever been and well worthy of it's selection for the final. Boquets to Jack Wilson, Tom Lawton and the Openshaw lads on the smart turn-out.

GORTON PIRATES LEAGUE CHAMPIONS 1960 !

For the few people who braved the weather on Sun. Nov. 13th the most exciting match of the season was the reward. In continual rain and on a track that looked like a suet pudding Gorton Pirates fought their hardest match this year to scrape home winners 49 - 47 over Yorkshire's Lindale Lions.

Which ever team had won they would be league champions and with such evenly-matched teams it was a pity one of them had to lose. Indeed every rider deserved a medal for their never-give-up attitude under appalling conditions.

With the odds on Gorton on their home track the first heat was drawn after P. Bates had fallen. Gorton star-man Marsland led D. Bates over the line and with Barker 3rd the Pirates took the lead. Cockcroft and Ormonroyd reversed this in Ht 3 over Watling this being the only point he dropped. A win for Betts then the Marsland/Williams pair took a 5 - 1 over Sutcliffe, two more 4 - 2's for Gorton and things looked bad for the Lions but once again Cockcroft and Ormonroyd put the Yorkshire team back in the fight with a brilliant 5 - 1 over Marsland, and what a race that was with Vinny at the back from the gate and the Lindale pair hanging on to the slim lead and only a wheel separated them at the finish. Lindale were now only two points down. Clever riding from Brooke and Sutcliffe kept Airey at the back for a 3-3 then a 4-2 from Bartholomew and Lee and Gorton were 4 in front. Ht 14 saw the best race of the match with Betts into the bend first, but coming out he misjudged the distance and Cockcroft went past on the outside and Brooke shot past on the inside and despite desperate attempts to split them stayed in front to score a 5-1 and level the scores at 42 - 42 with 2 heats to go. Another win from Ormonroyd and so Watling, Cockcroft, Marsland and D. Bates lined up at the gate for the NCM with the scores level at 45-45 ! A drawn match would be good enough for Gorton who were a point in front of Lindale in the league table. From the gate it was Watling? Cockcroft, Marsland and Bates and after 4 laps of hard riding the position was the same past the finishing post and Gorton were Division 1 Champions and the first to congratulate them were runners-up Lindale Lions with three cheers from Captain Dave Bates and three for Lindale from Skipper John Bartholomew. Looking round at all the muddy faces of the two teams everyone looked as if every race had been worth it all. So for the first time Gorton hold the Div 1 Championship.

No one can be picked out individually as every rider rode his heart out special mention must go to Watling and the Cockcroft/Ormonroyd pairing.

TOMMY LAWTON (OPENSHAW)

Tom started riding in 1953 with his present club in Div II & after an up and down season his scores improved on moving into Div I, made the League Indiv. Final that year. Into 1955 and his scores were more often than not double figures, rode for Lancashire 3 Times

His high scores helped Openshaw win Div 1 in 1956 and a place in the Grand Prix. Was Openshaws mainstay through 1957. 1958 saw Tom in The Grand Prix and League Indiv. Final and being placed 4th in the Lincs Final. Openshaw won the League again in 1959 with good scores from Lawton. This season he won the League Indiv Semi-final and rode twice for Lincs. Through most of these years Tom was Manager of his team and put much hard work into running his club which has twice been on the verge of disbanding but through his efforts kept in circulation.

Tom has never had much luck in Individuals but a better team man would be hard to find.
