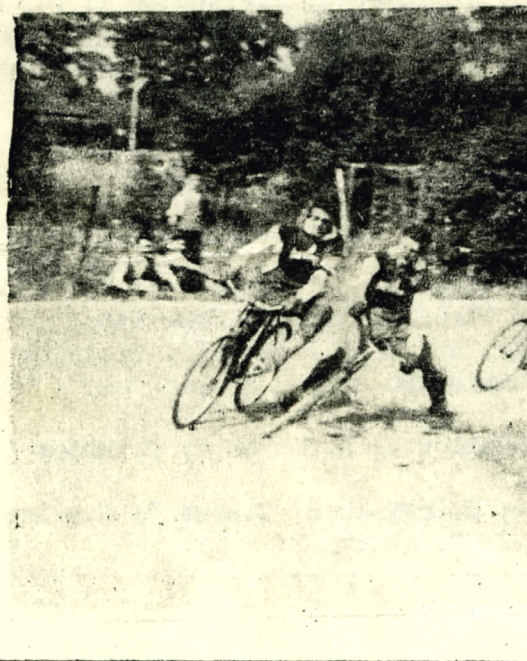

Visitors to Offerton on April 9th were Openshaw Monarchs and after a close and hard fought match Offerton won by 8points 52-44 to win their first Div 1 match of the season and take Openshaws unbeaten record.

The Devils went straight into the lead with a 5-1 from Davenport & Groom, 2 draws then a 5-1 from Robinson & Bailey put the score at 12-12, Garnett & Bevin slammed in two 5-1's but the visitors retaliated with maximum heat wins from Edwards/McGuinness and Lawton/Wansborough pairings to put the score at 33-33. For Offerton Garnett was unbeaten with both Bevin & Groom a tremendous improvement on their last years form, Hinchliffe had 3 wins and a blob. Openshaw are confident of revenge in the return match.

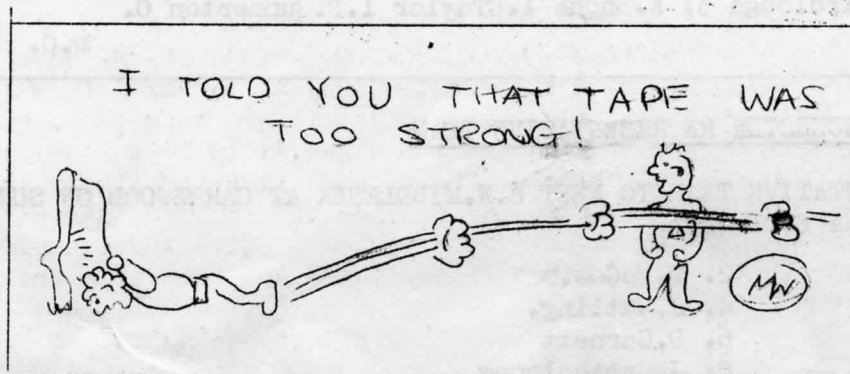

When the team folded up in 1958 he and team-mate John Sutcliffe went to Wakefield to ride for Lindale and within weeks he was notching double-figures regularly, and he topped the season by winning the Yorkshire Individual Championship with 13 points from Brooke and Johnston.

1960 and a serious illness at the start of the seson knocked his points do-wn for a while but he fought back into double figure class.As captain of Lindale he took them to The National Team Championship Final,TWinners of the Manchester K.O.Trophy and The North of England Trophy and League runnersUp.
